**ORDINANCE NO. 2105**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING  
§10.12.045 OF THE DERBY  
MUNICIPAL CODE, PROHIBITING  
TRESPASS FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
STANDING OR PARK A VEHICLE;  
AND REPEALING ORIGINAL  
§182.1 OF SAID ORDINANCE.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE  
GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY  
OF DERBY, KANSAS:**

**Section 1.** §10.12.045 of  
the Derby Municipal code is  
amended to read as follows:

**10.12.045 Trespass for the  
purpose of standing or parking  
a vehicle.**

A. No person shall stand or  
park any vehicle, boat, trailer or  
other piece of equipment upon  
the property of another without  
the consent of the property

owner, his or her authorized  
agent or other person authorized  
to have control of such property.

B. Standing or parking a  
vehicle, boat, trailer or other  
piece of equipment on the  
property of another contrary  
to the posting of adequate  
information upon such property,  
or the verbal notice of the  
owner, his or her authorized  
representative or other person  
authorized to have control of  
such property, shall constitute  
a trespass for the purpose of  
standing or parking such vehicle,  
boat, trailer or other piece of  
equipment.

C. Any person convicted of a  
violation of this section shall be  
punished:

1. For a first violation, by a  
fine of \$20;
2. For a second violation  
within one year, by a fine of

\$60; and

3. For a third or subsequent  
violation with one year, by a fine  
of \$100;

provided, that court costs shall  
not be assessed in connection  
with any such conviction.

**Section 2.** Original §10.12.045  
of the Derby Municipal Code is  
hereby repealed.

**Section 3.** This Ordinance  
shall be effective from and after  
its passage and publication once  
in the official City newspaper.
